DISTRICT COURT (INTOXICATING LIQUOR) RULES 2011

1. (1) These Rules, which may be cited as the District Court (Intoxicating Liquor) Rules 2011, shall come into operation on the 9th day of February 2011.

(2) These Rules shall be construed together with the District Court Rules 1997 (S.I. No. 93 of 1997) and all other District Court Rules.

(3) The District Court Rules as amended by these Rules may be cited as the District Court Rules 1997 to 2011.

2. The Form numbered 72.4 in Schedule C of the District Court Rules, 1997 (S.I. No. 93 of 1997) shall be deleted and the Form bearing the like number in Schedule 1 hereof shall be added to the Forms in Schedule C of the District Court Rules, 1997 (S.I. No. 93 of 1997) in substitution therefor.

3. The holder hereof is hereby required during every period of exemption to keep affixed on the outside of the said premises a notice in legible letters in the form in the Schedule hereto.
